How do you identify the realm of dreams?

In the Bible, dreams are mentioned in both the Old Testament and the New Testament. Kings in the Old Testament took their dreams very seriously; they understood that dreams carried significant consequences. If the scholars and sages were unable to interpret and explain the dreams to the king, they were even put to death. God still communicates through dreams and visions. Dreams can be categorized into three different types: processing dreams, dreams from God, and dreams of darkness.

The spiritual world is real, and this is often reflected in dreams. In this brochure, we present dreams from the darkness and how that darkness can operate in a person's life. If you pay attention to what you dream, you can start to spiritually see what's really going on in your life. You may begin to recognize certain dreams as they occur more frequently. There's often a pattern present.

The identification of dreams

First, it is important to distinguish between dreams. Dreams from God are often colorful, while those from darkness tend to be gray or black-and-white. If you have dreamed and wake up, take a moment to reflect on how you felt in the dream; for instance, were you anxious, panicked, tired, or happy? The feeling you experience in a dream reveals a lot. Dreams in which you are fleeing, drowning, caged, or speaking with dead people or family members often have a dark spirit behind them.

Dreams of darkness often scare you and sneak in subtly. Sometimes, a dream from darkness may appear completely innocent, yet it plants the wrong seeds in your mind.

"The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly."

—John 10:10

You can recognize whether there are still ties binding you to darkness through your dreams. These are often dreams that resemble each other and come back regularly. This way, you can identify if, for example, a spirit of death, witchcraft, or Freemasonry is still active and influencing your life. If you have engaged in idolatry or if idolatry has been practiced in previous generations, this can have an effect in your life. In dreams, you can begin to recognize these types of patterns.

"You shall not bow down to them nor serve them. For I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children to the third and fourth generations of those who hate Me."

You can divide dreams of darkness into two categories:

- There are attacking dreams, in which darkness seeks to enter to keep you away from God and to bind you.
- There are dreams where you feel there remains a connection with darkness. Consider this: being on the run, swimming in murky waters, being in a labyrinth from which one cannot escape, being trapped in your own home.

An attacking dream

For example, you might dream that you're bitten by a snake or a dog. These dreams can have different effects.



A snake represents darkness; the snake spoke to Eve. As a result, her thinking was poisoned by a half-truth.

This led to rebellion and disobedience against God. These are often deceptive thoughts that we receive without recognizing them. A bite from a serpent in a dream often leaves you feeling weary in the days that follow and fosters thoughts against God. You then notice a distance.

A dog is a family animal; it typically would not bite someone in its own household. If you are bitten by a dog in a dream, it often means that someone known to you, or a family member, is speaking curses about your life. This is often caused by a spirit of witchcraft. The consequence can be that you feel a certain pressure coming after this dream.

If you wake up and remember the dreams, you can break and reject all the consequences that have come from them.

A dream with a generational bond

Talking to the dead in a dream

It is often family members or friends who approach you in a dream. The person who approaches you in the dream is a demonic spirit that presents itself as a family member or friend. In this dream, they give you a lottery number or something similar. By accepting this, a covenant is made. If you open yourself up to this, a spirit of death can enter your life.

Regularly dreaming and speaking with deceased family members is often a generational bond in your life. These demonic powers want to maintain and continue the generational bond in the bloodline of the family. This often leads to depression and suicidal thoughts.

The breaking of a generational bond

Choose today to distance yourself from anything you recognize in your family history. Think of illnesses, premature death, depression, fears, addictions. Break the generational bond and declare that all its consequences shall be removed from your life.
